REPORT ON THE LAST SOUTHERN SECTION MEETING at Worthing on 12th June 2010.

Brian Baldock displayed **AUSTRALIA AT WAR, WORLD WAR 1 AND 2** at the final meeting of this section.

Opening with World War material Brian showed a wide variety of covers, cards, maps and related ephemera. Of particular note were patriotic postcards, P.O.W. letters and cards, poster stamps, and a correspondence from Arthur Hatley to Dear Lil telling her about his life overseas.

The second part continued in similar vein, Bereavement cards, Red Cross items and many items of P.O.W. mail. Moving on to WW2, we saw postcards showing Field Post numbers 1, 2 and 3 together with Civil Censorship numbers 3, 4, 6, 8 and 11. There were many sheets of covers from personnel in the Air Force and Navy and many telegrams.

In the final part, Brian displayed covers from many areas of war, Middle East, North Africa, particularly El Alamein and Tobruk and Malaya. The display was wide ranging covering many areas in the Pacific. The conclusion showed several sheets of items relating to the Japanese Surrender.

A really interesting display, spoilt only by the low attendance.
